This will be done in person at Summer Camps in Maine hosted by Seeds Of Peace and by Middlebury College in Monterey. Whereas Seeds of Peace is tackling endemic cultural misconceptions Middlebury and it's Critical Issues Forum is exploring fresh perspectives on nuclear non-proliferation through the eyes of the young adults who life in nuclear countries.

The stakes have never been higher, the gaps in our understanding of each other have never been wider and the opportunity for positive change never greater. We are proud to support the aspirational good work of these organizations as they look for innovative solutions to systemically chronic problems.

This project aligns with our Convene, Collaborate, and Create campaign which continues to be a cornerstone of our mission, and we are not about to give up. We are more determined than ever to develop collaborative relationships with those who strive to make the world a better place.
